Directive (EU) 2018/851 amending Waste Framework Directive 2008/98/EC kicks in the duty for suppliers of articles to submit information to the so called SCIP-database, as from 5^{th} January 2021.

SCIP stands for **S**ubstances of **C**oncern **I**n articles as such or in complex objects (**P**roducts). The SCIP-database ensures that the information on articles containing Candidate List substances is available throughout the whole lifecycle of products and materials, including at the waste stage. Companies supplying articles containing substances of very high concern (SVHC) on the Candidate List in a concentration above 0.1% weight by weight (w/w) on the EU market have to submit information on these articles to ECHA (European Chemicals Agengy).

On the basis of the actually available information we confirm to our best knowledge that thyssenkrupp Rasselstein does not produce any articles or products being subject to the duty of SCIP-notification.
